

St. Louis Office for Developmental Disability Resources Minutes of the Program Committee February 7, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 4:03pm.

- Southside Wellness Center submitted a request to assist them purchase two new vehicles to replace older vehicles in their fleet. They received Mo Dot's 5310 grant and need to pay 20% down to receive the vehicles. They have fundraised 50% of their 20% down payment and need another \$13,000. Nina Murphy moved to grant Southside Wellness Center's request for \$13,000 to complete their 20% down payment. Cynthia Mueller seconded. Vote all in favor. Motion passed.
- 2. UCP Heartland submitted a request to raise the unit rate from \$10.25 to \$13.00 to match the DMH rate. Nina Murphy moved to increase the unit rate to \$13.00. Cynthia Mueller seconded. Vote all in favor. Motion passed.
- 3. UCP Heartland submitted a request to operate a youth camp during times when school is not in session. They would like to operate with a unit rate of \$13.41. This change will take effect when the agency submits their funding application for the next fiscal year.
- 4. Stanford Cooper with House of Pais submitted a request to raise the limit of individuals served from age 21 to 25. After discussion, the committee denied the request.
- 5. The Recreation Council of Greater St. Louis asked to collaborate on a way to modify their funding award to align with their camp registration deadlines. When their application is submitted in March, a portion of their funding award will be applied to July to September, and then October through September into the next funding cycle. The committee agreed to the proposed changes.
- 6. During a file review at Horizon Housing North, Nate Head discovered one of the staff members have a potentially disallowed criminal history. Nate Head will follow up with the DMH guidelines of disqualifying crimes and provide that information to the committee.
- 7. The Center for Head Injury Services has a March target date of opening their café in south city St. Louis.
- 8. Agency funding applications are due March 1, 2019. The committee would like for the agency to review funding applications and provide notes/recommendations on applications.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:22pm.
