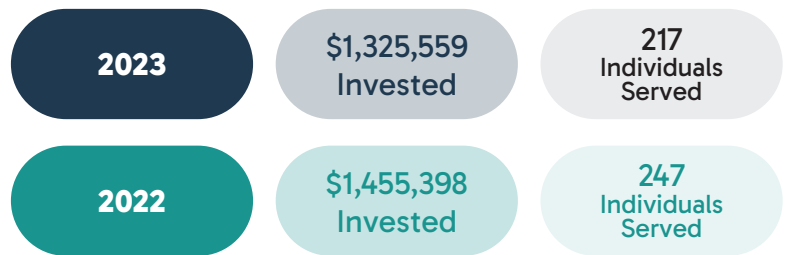
COMMUNITY LIVING

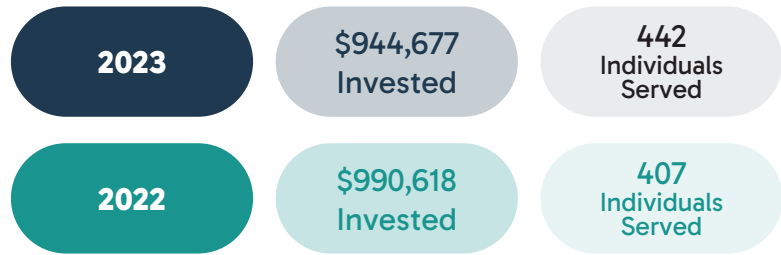
COMMUNITY INTEGRATION

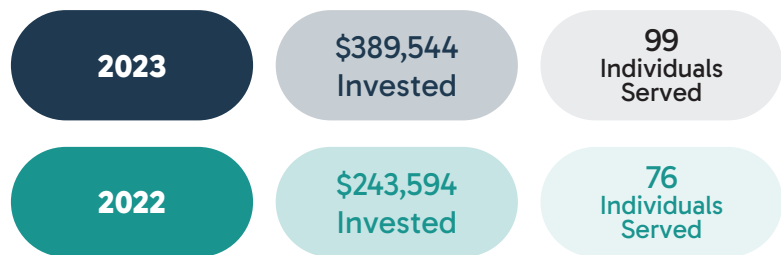
PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

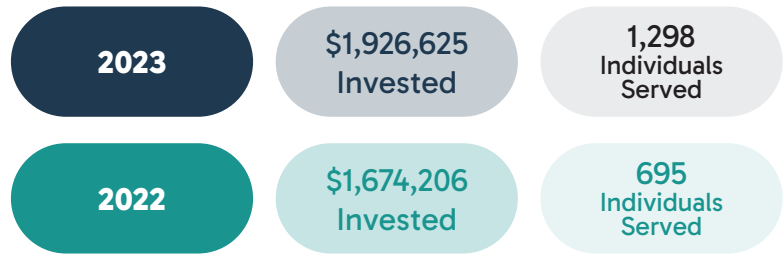
SUPPORT SYSTEMS

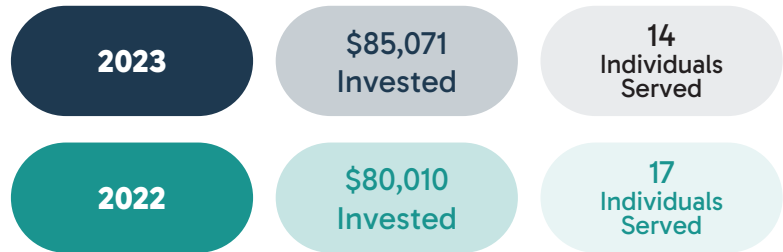
EMPLOYMENT TRAINING

85%	87%	Individuals secure employment that utilizes newly developed skills

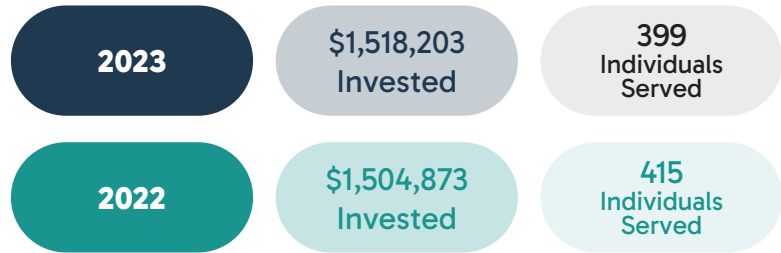
EMPLOYMENT SERVICES
